Work Accomplished

County Stands Eighth From Bottom In List of Counties Obtaining Relief Funds.

Randolph county stands eighth from the bottom of the list of counties in the state in the amount of federal aid received and dispensed since the first of October.

Beginning in October there were 400 "card cases," for a card index record is kept of every family or individual receiving aid from the county or federal fund.

One hundred persons received hospital treatment, hospitalization chiefly at the Randolph Hospital, Inc.

Thirty-seven families moved from Randolph county towns back to the country and started farming.

Eighty work projects have been begun and completed. These include work on cemeteries, beautification, painting schools and churches.
