Relief Administrator Gets Specific Instructions Relative Child Labor

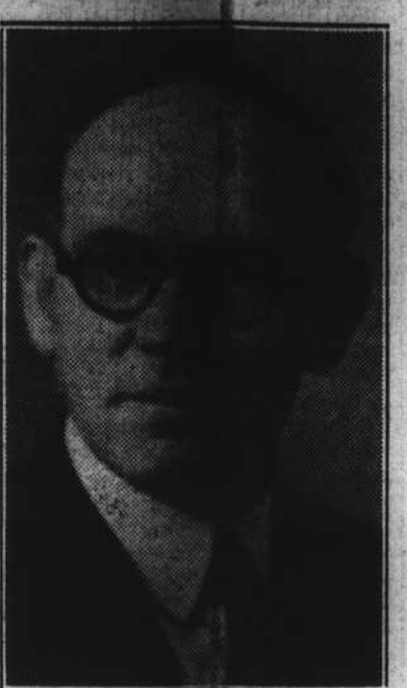
R. T. Lloyd, Relief Administrator of Randolph county, has received a call this week for twenty-four white men for C. C. enlistment on July 9th.

Your job is to stop the children, no matter who is employing them. Ask your local officers to investigate every child selling on the streets and stop every one that does not hold a permit from you.

Relative Child Labor Mr. Lloyd has also received another letter from A. L. Fletcher, Commissioner of Labor, concerning minor children working.

Boys over fourteen may be employed within the restrictions fixed by law, to do street sales of newspapers, magazines and other merchandise.
