The annual meeting of the members of the Randolph Hospital corporation was held on Tuesday at the hospital in Asheboro with a full attendance who heard the satisfactory report. The fact that hospital management had been able to operate during the year 1934 without a financial loss, was the source of enthusiastic applause by the group.

The number of patients admitted during the year was 699. The number of patients released was 708, 63 of whom were colored. These cases were classified as follows: Medicine, 112; surgery, 292; obstetrics, 109; eye, ear, nose and throat, 30; gynecology, 69; dermatology, 1; communicable, 8; urology, 41; orthopedics, 41.
