While nothing regarding possible njuries has been received, men familiar with the danger of tropical sun ray's in the mid-Pacific pointed to extreme illnesses and disablement often caused persons exposed for lengthy times.

Navy fliers continued their ever scanning trips over the waters and coral islands in the vicinity where it is believed the missing pair were forced down. The planes will cease operations at sun down but the navy vessels will continue their searchlight beams over the waters until the sun rises for another
