#### Gas Daily Japan Abandons Concession At Hankow Seaport

Action Without Precedent Is History of Far East Relatively.

#### Warfare Continues

#### Diplomats Avert Dutch War That Was Averted Armistice On March.

(By The Associated Press) Japanese and Chinese diplomats have expressed hope that formal declared war between their countries can be averted, but warfare still plagues central China and in the north formidable armadas move towards Tientsin.

Early withdrawal of thousands

of Japanese from widely separated

parts of China reached a climax

when the Japanese navy, under

instructions from Tokyo, ordered

prompt abandonment of the Jap-

anese concession at Hankow, great

port and industrial center.

Orders were issued for all Japanese, to be allowed safe passage

aboard ships en route to Japan,

where they will be granted

asylum by the Japanese govern-

ment, and no Japanese may

remain in China after Aug. 15.

The Japanese government has

not yet issued any specific

order to withdraw its forces

from the city, but it has

been reported that the Japanese

will leave the city by Aug. 15.
