
Rush For Citizenship Makes Judge Suspicious

TOSEPH PILSUDSKI was a social revolutionary working for the future of Poland when the World War burst on Europe. He met Edward Smigly-Rydz. His nation lies between Red Russia and Nazi Germany—can he keep these enemies apart? His nation is a republic surrounded by iron rule-can he preserve the national
