AN ORDINANCE Concerning the Asheville Street Railway Company:

Be it ordained that the Asheville Street Railway Company is hereby authorized and permitted to make, construct, maintain and se a single track railway for the transporta ilon of passengers, along such streets in the city of Asheville as may be selected and determined by the Mayor and Aldermen of the city for the term of twenty years from the passage of this Ordinance, and for that purpose may excavate and grade, under the di-The only democratic daily rection of an engineer appointed therefor by the said Mayor and Aldermen, the streets selected and determined as aforesaid, to such any of its c tizens be created thereby, and it may operate and run its cars every day of the week if it see fit so to do. But the privileges hereby granted shall not be considered or deemed exclusive, the said Mayor and Aldermen hereby expressly reserving the power of granting like privileges to any other corporation, person or persons after the expiration of ten years from the date of this Ordinance.

Provided, further, that the said road be continuously operated and be made upon and subject to the conditions hereinafter made and provided, the violation of any of which shall operate as a forfeiture of the franchis and privileges above granted. The Mayor and Aldermen of the said city may from time to time, prescribe regulations for the opera-tion and management of the said railway; impose flues and penalties for the violation thereof or any of them, and may at its pleas-ure suspend the running of the cars and the operation of the said railway.
