others west of the Alleghanies who think they have claims to either the first or the second place on the party ticket. But the East has also its batch of candidates, among whom Hiscock and Depew, of New York, are the most promising. New York republicans would, no doubt, be conceeded the right to name the head of the ticket if they could, with any confidence, engage to give New York's 36 electoral votes. Failing to do this, they could hardly expect to name even the Vice-President, as there is not now, as in 1880, a Conkling to placate. The feeling that luck comes to the republican party only when its candidate for the presidency is a Western man is likely to assert itself with unusual force after the failure of the experiment of 1884. The situation is rather worse than it was in that year. Then New York, Indiana, Connecticut and New Jersey were doubtful States, but now Michigan, Minnesota, Wisconsin, Illinois and California are added to the list. The republicans will now have to fight a defensive campaign in some of the States they carried easily in 1884, and their canvass will be up-Hon. Daniel G. Fowle, the nominee for hill work in the four States first mentioned. some of which they will have to carry in order to gain the 19 votes Blaine lacked. From the nature of the issue at stake it may be inferred that they will make their chief effort in New Jersey, Connecticut and Indiana, where there are enough protectionist democrats, it is hoped, to decide the election in favor of the republican nominees. This view of the situation, should it prevail at Chicago, would go far, of course, to make the ticket Gresham and Phelps, or Harrison and Hawley. It is to be kept in mind, Richness of Flavor is unexhowever, that the Blaine delegates will be in the majority at Chicago, and they may have grudges to satisfy and ends of their own to effect which may spoil the most carefully devised prognostications. It is not certainly known that they have yet abandoned fully and completely the idea of nominating Mr. Blaine in spite of all his declinations.
