To provide that the Aldermen of the Cityo Asheville may negotiate a loan of One Hinired Thousand Dollars, for the use and benethe City of Asheville, That for the purpos of obtaining the consent of a majority of the qualified and registered voters of the city hat borrow the sum of One Hundred Thousand and permanent improvements, an electon 1888 at the usual voting place, and under he sum of money upon the bonds of the saidity to be made and issued, in their discretion in the denomination of Fifty, One Hundred and Five Hundred Dollars, with interest courons

The said bonds shall become due and plyable thirty years from their date and for ifterest at the rate of six per centum per anum, payable semi-annually, according to the coupons attached, on the first days of January and July in each andevery year. And hey shall be signed by the Mayor and courter;

signed by the Treasurer, and be under the seal of said city.

The said bonds shall in no case be disposed of, sold, assigned, or transferred for a less price than par. The coupons of said bonds shall be at all times when due, receivable in paymen of taxes due said city. H. S. HARKINS, Mayer.
