James Jones had fine luck hunting wild turkeys lately. He killed six in two days.

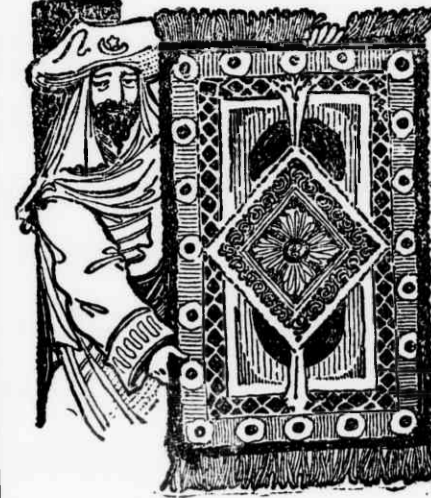

Rowley Hooker and his sister, Miss Mary, spent a few days in Brevard last week having dental work done. They are well pleased with the Brevard dentist.

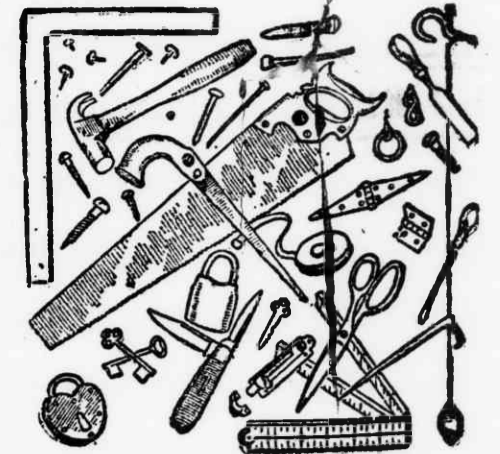
