trouble begins.

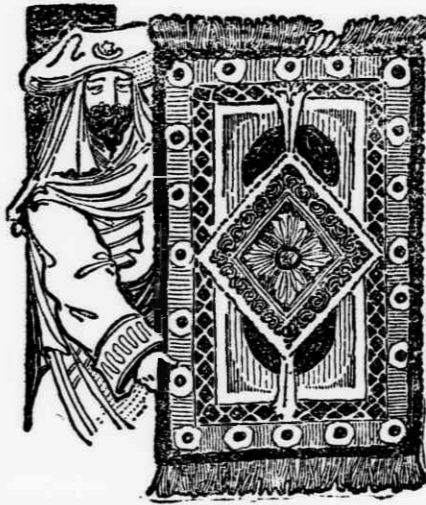
Ralph Newcom, a friend of Jack's,
