Our last issue of the Sylvan Valley News has been so liber ally praised by home people that we feel encouraged to tell its pat rons something more in regard to the plant and its capabilities. We are now occupying the building erected by J. J. Miner, senior member of the firm, especially for a print shop, and its adaptability for the purpose it was designed to serve is everywhere evident. The floor is doubled with building paper between, making it impossible for cold feet to interfere with work; the light is so diffused in the room that nowhere is there a dark corner and getting between the light and another workman is impossible; the walls were sheathed with inch lumber on the inside and lathed and plastered against the sheathing, making the plastered walls as firm as brick; the 9,000 lb Potter press rests on a cement foundation entirely independent of the building and when running not a tremble criticise the naval budget of the or a jar can be felt by those standing around it.
