## Normal and Industrial School, Brevard, N. C.

A "Home" School for Girls—A Day School for Boys and Girls.



## School Year of Nine Months Opens September 5, 1905.

The Brevard Normal and Industrial School will open Sept. 5. Although remarkable advancement has been made since the opening, less than two years ago, our present term will eclipse the previous openings in many respects.

The faculty has been increased by three new members: Miss Willia E. Davis of North Carolina in the Highschool, Miss Judith Isbell from Missouri in the Business Department and Miss Hattie Raines of Nashville, Ten., four years an instructor, will teach sewing.

The music department will be supplied with three additional pianos, making four in all.

Special attention will be given to the Business Department. For bookkeepers, stenographers and typewriters there is an ever increasing demand and our school will offer these courses in the most approved methods.

The demand for teachers is so pressing that it is necessary to

supply that demand by opening a Normal Department, giving especial attention to work of training teachers. All of our students examined last year, so far as has been learned, were successful in securing first grade certificates. One enthusiastic student writes that she secured a first class with no branch below ninety and that she will return to Brevard with a sister and six other girls from her community as soon as she teaches out her present school.

While the above courses are partly new features, the regular school work will be improved. For the systematic development of the mind a well graded high-school is the best device that has ever been invented. Such a school should be cherished and supported by every community because it puts into the reach of nearly everyone a ten years' course of systematic mental development. It takes the boys and girls from the streets: in-

stead of idle thoughts it gives them mental food that develops them into useful men and women.

The greatest safeguard that any parent can throw around his family is to put his children, when young, into a good nine or ten months school and have them trained and developed year by year until they are grown.

The Brevard Normal and Industrial School is especially designed for students of limited means and to this end its expenses are far below those of similar institutions that do a similar grade of work.

This year in our patronage will be represented South Carolina, Tennessee, Missouri and perhaps twenty-five counties of North Carolina.

The fall term will open September 5, and patrons and pupils are invited to the opening at 10 a. m. of that date.

## Peace Terms Accepted!

### Japan and Russia Come to an Agreement and the War Is Ended!

### Japan Wins Every Point for which Her Army and Navy Have Been Fighting!

## President Roosevelt the Hero of the Hour!

PORTSMOUTH, N. H., August 29.—Peace between Russia and Japan was practically concluded today. The Japanese receded from their demands for indemnity and for the repurchase of the northern half of Sakhalin, Russia at the same time agreeing to the division of the island. The Japanese withdrew articles ten and eleven of the peace conditions originally proposed for the surrender of the interned war ships and limitation of the Russian naval power in the Far East. Barring these recessions, Japan won on every point. She gains the Kingdom of Korea, Port Arthur and the Liao-Tung peninsula and drives Russia out of Manchuria, thus restoring that province to China, and also opening its doors

to the trade of the world. Japan also almost doubles the strength of her navy by ships captured from Russia. Everything for which Japan fought has been won.

As the news that the plenipotentiaries had agreed to conclude peace spread through the city all the church bells began to ring and there was general rejoicing.

Throughout the late afternoon and evening messages of congratulation by the score poured in upon the president from people both in America and in Europe. The great part he has played in bringing about the success of the conference and in promoting the interests of civilization is recognized throughout the world, as is indicated by the cordiality and

wide range covered by the congratulatory dispatches.

Japan gains Korea, Port Arthur and the Liao-Tung peninsula, half of the island of Sakhalin, Russia is driven out of Manchuria and the province restored to China, Japan falling heir to certain immensely valuable railroads built by Russia in the province. Beside the strength of the Japanese navy has been almost doubled by ships captured from Russia.

## Brevard Water Supply.

As a matter of interest to the many strangers now within our borders, as well as to the home consumers of the Brevard water supply, we take pleasure in publishing the following analysis made by Gerald McCarthy, state biologist, and forwarded from Raleigh to T. S. Boswell, Superintendent of the Brevard Water Company Aug. 23. To those who are seeking "good water" there is no necessity for looking beyond Brevard to find it. Here is the analysis:

Temperature, 26 C—Turbidity 0; sediment, 0; color, 0; odor, 0; reaction, neutral.

Chlorides per million parts, 2.7; Nitrites " " .0; Nitrates " " trace

Alum. 0; free ammonia, .026; albuminoid ammonia, .026.

Contains—Algae, none; infusoria, none; organic detritus, none; bacteria, common saprophytic only.

Remarks—Good water.

If people who come to the mountains for a summer outing want good water while here' Brevard is the place to find it. At least this analysis by the state chemist proves that we have it.
