It is true that cement walks are more modern and stylish than brick, and in cities which have outgrown old fashions the brick walks are being supplanted with cement, but until the street grades are thoroughly establish ed cement should not be used.

There isn't a property owner in Brevard but can well afford to build a brick walk in front of his premises, and if he has a vacant lot for sale a good walk will sell it for enough more to pay well for the investment. In case of vacant lots owned by outside parties the Town should build good walks (where adjacent property have walks) and charge the cost against the lots, to be collected as other taxes.
