Democrats of Transylvania County Put Their Ticket in the Field.

Pursuant to notice the democratic county convention assembled at the court house in Brevard last Saturday, June 23, and was called to order by County Chairman W. P. Whitmire.

On motion W. W. Zachary was chosen permanent chairman and J. L. Bell secretary, with A. M. Verdery as assistant secretary.

A resolution (which appears below) was introduced by J. L. Bell and unanimously passed.

The following preamble and resolution, introduced by J. L. Bell, was unanimously passed by the convention:

Whereas, it is reported through the press of this district that certain counties have passed resolutions that "after the first ballot the delegates to the Judicial and Congressional conventions shall vote as a unit when the majority directs it." And, whereas, such action is contrary to the democratic plan of organization adopted by the entire state. Therefore be it

Resolved, by the democratic party of Transylvania county, in convention assembled, that we believe such action is in plain disregard of party law; subversive of the will of the people as expressed in the primaries; unfair and unjust to the smaller counties; destructive to party harmony; conducive to party strife, dissension and division. And we believe such action should be deprecated and opposed by all democrats individually and when in convention assembled.

The following resolution was adopted without a dissenting vote:

Resolved, that we, the democrats of Transylvania county, in our county convention assembled, do most heartily approve of and endorse the able stand taken by our United States Senator, Hon. F. M. Simmons, on all the great ques-

tions that have been before the Senate of the United States, believing that his course has been for the promotion of the best interests of our state and for our nation also, and respectfully ask our State Senator and our Representative in the next General Assembly of North Carolina to aid in re-electing him to the honorable position for another six years.
