DEATH OF MRS. BURRELL.

The community was shocked Monday on receiving the sad intelligence of the sudden death, at Asheville of Mrs. Bright Burrell. She had been seized on Friday previous with a mysterious and baffling malady, for which an operation seemed to be necessary, and she had accordingly been taken to the hospital at Asheville for treatment. An operation was performed, but she did not survive, dying Monday afternoon. The body was brought back to Brevard, and funeral services delayed to await the coming of some of her absent children.

The deceased was a sister of Morgan Waters, who died suddenly in July 1907. Her maiden name was Elizabeth Waters. She was married to Bright Burrell. Of this union four sons and three daughters survive; Zeb, Erwin, Napoleon and O. Burrell, and Mrs. Johnson, Mrs. Carhart and Mrs. Will Bracken. Mrs. Burrell was a member of the Presbyterian church, and a woman of fine character and lovable disposition.

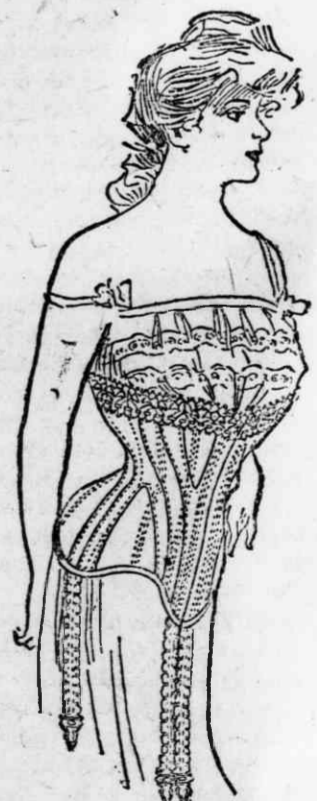
