## OBITUARY.

R. T. WHITMIRE.

The subject of this sketch died in the state of Texas Dec. 1st, 1908, and was buried in Rock Creek cemetery, near Blanket, Texas. Mr. Whitmire was born on East Fork of French Broad river, in this county, June 11, 1846. He lived in Transylvania until about four years ago, at which time he sold his home on Little river and moved to Texas. Mr. Whitmire was an old Confederate veteran, having enlisted in the Confederate army at about 18 years of age and served until the close of the war. He was married to Mrs. Julia Phillips, June 11, 1871. To them were born four children, three sons and one daughter.

Mr. Whitmire professed religion soon after he came home from the war, but did not join the church until about twenty years ago, when Brothers Wampler and Greer held a meeting for two weeks at Dividing Ridge church. At that meeting he attached himself to the M. E. Church, South, and lived a Christian until the end of his life. He exemplified the characteristics of a Christian man in all the affairs of his life. He was a kind and affectionate husband, a loving and faithful father, a good neighbor and a Christian gentleman.

Mr. Whitmire was well known in this county, having spent the greater part of his life commended itself to all who knew him for the virtues that marked his character. It would be hard to say too much of this good man who has taken his departure from this world to, we trust, that heavenly land where the path of the just shines as the perfect day. During the last years of his life Mr. Whitmire was a great sufferer. Ever since his arrival in Texas he has been confined to his room by affliction, which affliction he bore patiently to the end. And so from every land and country we are passing to the great beyond. May the Father of our spirits gather us all safely on the other side.

## AS A "DISTRIBUTING POINT."

It is of interest, too, in this connection, to note that practically all the freight received at Brevard is consigned to Hendersonville—Hendersonville Hustler.

As a sample of bombastic ignorance the above item hasn't a peer. Before publishing such a statement the pencil pusher of that windy journal should have consulted some freight agent or conductor of the Southern railway. Not a piece of freight is receivable by any conductor on the Southern system if so shipped that it must be rebilled at Hendersonville for points on the Transylvania railroad. Occasionally through ignorance or error a shipment for Brevard has to be rebilled at Hendersonville, but it is a notorious fact that every such shipment reaches here short or damaged. If our neighbor had a chance at Brevard freights, as a "distributing point," most of it would be "distributed" before it reached here.

There is one other fact that our windy contemporary doesn't know, or at least doesn't advertise. If a traveler outside the Southern system wants a ticket to Hendersonville he must buy to Asheville, Brevard or Lake Toxaway. Hendersonville is not known to ticket sellers while these three other points are "on the map." Study the map brother and find-out "where you are at."

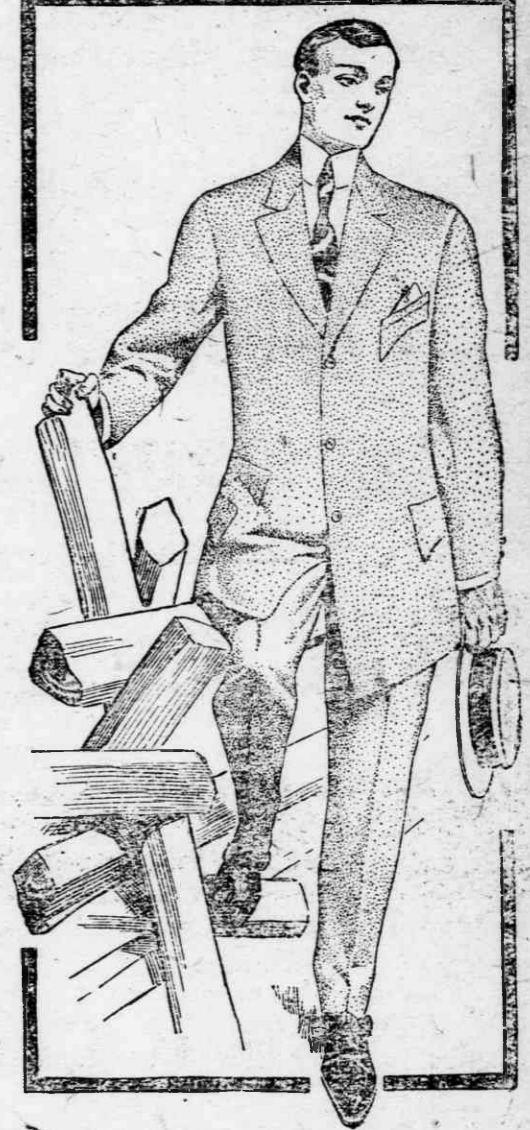
