The Greenville News says that a meeting has been called for the latter part of this week in Hendersonville for the consideration of the proposed electrification of the Greenville and Western Railway and its extension from Greenville to Asheville. Brevard needs to get a look-in on this proposition.

Three cheers for Andrews and its aldermen, who have taken the bull by the horns and run the cattle off the streets. It took lots of nerve in the face of a recent election resulting in letting the cattle roam in the streets. The Southern promised to make improvements at the depot upon banishment of cattle from the streets.

What would you think of a direct road from Greenville to Asheville through Brevard, the Mills River and Avery creek sections? When Transylvania begins its road building campaign the importance of this undertaking should not be overlooked. It behooves Transylvania to take advantage of those opportunities peculiarly its own.

## Greenville-Brevard-Asheville Road.

Since the people of Transylvania are discussing with considerable enthusiasm the question of improved roads, it is well that attention be called to those highways that would bring the greatest returns to this county.

That the road from Brevard to Greenville is by far more important from the standpoint of tourists (the value of whose presence is undisputed) than any other highway in the county, is undoubted because it is the direct road from the section from which we draw our patronage. The county's convicts are on this road and Greenville county authorities agree to improve the South Carolina end before next summer.

When improved, this road will be one of the best to the mountains and will be rich in mountain scenery and in order that tourists headed for Asheville from South Carolina and other Southern states may have a direct route to their destination it would be greatly to the advantage of Transylvania to improve the old Asheville road and shorten the distance from Brevard to Asheville by several miles rather than detour by way of Hendersonville.

This road goes by Patton's mill through the Mills River section of Henderson county and the Avery creek section of Buncombe. Prior to the flood Buncombe county had a force of hands on the Buncombe portion of the road, but it is understood that the work has not been resumed since that time. Transylvania would have but comparatively little work to do, the most difficult being in the Little mountain and Silver creek section, covering a distance of about one and one-half miles.

Were the counties to improve this road, and Buncombe has undertaken its part of the highway and Henderson county people would doubtless open their section, this would make a direct trunk line from Greenville to Asheville through Transylvania and the benefits to this county would many times justify the expenditure necessary in building the Transylvania portion of this road.

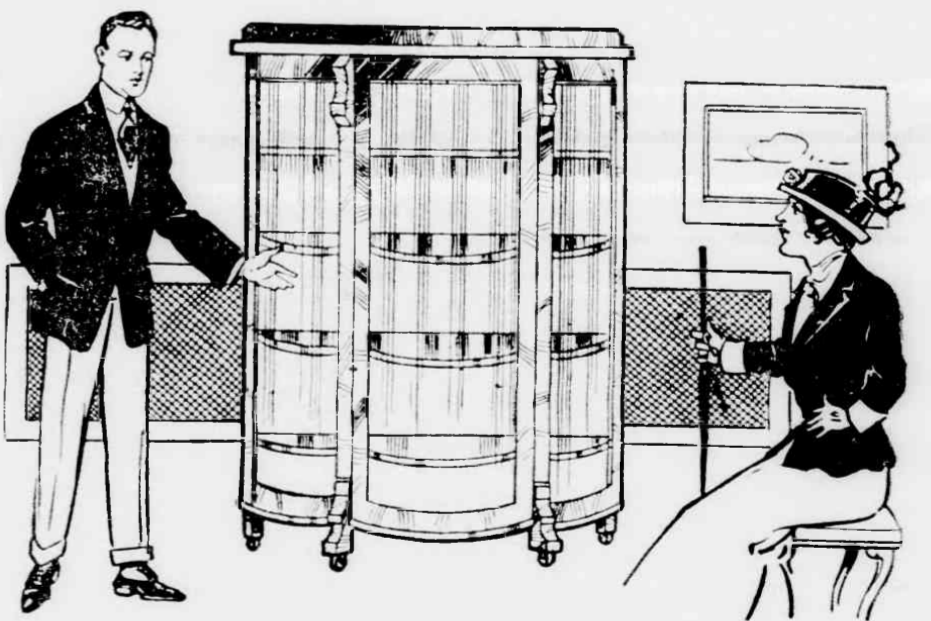
