Sec. 38:—Whenever the taxes shall be due and unpaid, the Sheriff shall immediately proceed to collect them, &c.

Sec. 55:—On the 1st Monday in February in each year, the Sheriff is directed to offer at public sale at the Court-house all lands on which the taxes hereof for the previous year still remain unpaid on the 1st Monday in January preceding.

I shall endeavor to follow strictly the above laws, therefore all parties are earnestly requested to come forward and settle their taxes. I will be in my office during the month of October, or you will find a deputy there, for the purpose of collecting taxes.
