This act was ratified on the 2d day of February and has been in force and effect ever since that day, and yet the citizens of Chatham have been in blissful ignorance of it and violating it every day since its passage, over two months ago. Mr. Self surely ought to have given them some timely notice of it.

Until our citizens can get the Supreme court to construc the above law, says the Chatham Record there will exist great doubt as to its meaning, for if it means what it says (as it reads) our good old county will be depopulated and there will be no need of providing a school fund, for there will be no children to educate.

It will be seen that section 1 allows certain hogs, sheep and goats six months, and section 2 allows certain cattle two years, but section 3 does not mention what time is allowed "Persons," and it is left in doubt whether they are allowed six months like goats, hogs and sheep, or are allowed two years like malecattle. If they are allowed two years, then there is some hope for them
