ADVANTAGE OF STOCK LAW.

We note that an observant and intelligent correspondent of the Fayetteville Observer has this to say:

"In travelling through territory where the stock law has been enforced for several years, I noticed that young pines are growing in great number and the probability is that a new growth of timber will soon exist in large areas that have been stripped of pine timber by lumbermen."

This is in itself a convincing argument in favor of the law for Moore County and ought to bear with more weight upon those who own land in the sand hill and pine woods section. Heretofore the claim has been by the people of the sand hills, that population has been sparse and the range for stock large and that the stock law would be against them. If the stock, pine rosters and mast eaters and scrub cattle could be kept off this territory the next generation would see a beautiful forest of virgin pines. In the mean time the present generation would enjoy a good living and a fruitful source of income from improved hogs and cows.

HENRY B. ADAMS, ESQ.

Prominent Candidate for Judge of Eight District.

Henry B. Adams, Esq., whose likeness appears above, is not only the oldest member of the Monroe bar in point of actual age, but also regards the length of time he has been such member of the bar. He is 52 years of age, and was sworn in as a practitioner in Moore Superior court in 1871, and moved to Monroe and began practice here in June 1872. Since that time he has continuously practiced in Union and adjoining counties, in both the State and Federal courts, winning a place among the leaders of his profession in North Carolina. He is naturally a very bright man, and to his native talent has added the culture that comes from years of study. His study of the law has been careful and thorough, and in the courthouse he is able to interpret the law with a quickness and accuracy that are marked. While, as said, his study has been the law, his reading has been varied sufficiently to make him what a well-informed and well equipped professional man should be outside of his profession.

Mr. Adams is a college bred man, having graduated at Trinity College under that great teacher, Dr. Craven. To his studious habits acquired there may be attributed the fact that he is so well rounded man today. Supplementing his literary training with a professional course, he began, as stated, the practice of law in 1871.

Mr. Adams is a steadfast believer in the fundamental principles of Jeffersonian Democracy, and has given his party much service, though he is not a professional politician. He has never been an office-seeker, though he has been honored by public service which he in turn honors. His fellow citizens at home have always known his char-

acter and worth, and have desired to honor him by calling him to very high public service. It was in this spirit that they went to the Congressional Convention at Lumberton in 1894, in which convention Mr. Adams received a very flattering vote until he withdrew on the 149th ballot when Hon. Jas. A. Lockhart was nominated on the next ballot. Previous to this time Mr. Adams had served as State Senator from Anson and Union in the General Assembly of 1887 where he won a considerable reputation as chairman of the Judiciary Committee, which is always considered the most important committee connected with the legislature. He was selected for this position from among a number of the ablest lawyers in the Senate, among them being such lawyers as Lt. Gov. Turner, the late S. J. Pemberton, Jas. L. Webb, Chas. F. Warren, C. C. Clarke and others. While on this committee he prepared several bills which were in controversy as to their constitutionality, Mr. Adams taking issue with many of the most learned lawyers on the points involved. Some of these statutes have since come before the Supreme Court, and without exception have been sustained, thus vindicating Mr. Adams' judgment as a constitutional lawyer.

Mr. Adams is a member of the Methodist church, being a trustee and steward in his church. He is also member of several fraternal orders, being a Royal Arch Mason, a member of the Knights of Pythias, Royal Arcanum, and Woodmen of the World. He is absolutely temperate in his habits, has not for years touched intoxicants of any kind, and is in every particular consistently living up to the requirements of his church and the various orders to which he belongs.

Recognizing the integrity of character, the eminent professional fitness, the faithful but unrewarded public service of Mr. Adams, his friends will present his name to the Judicial Convention to be held for the eight judicial district for the nomination for judge of that district, and they confidently expect his nomination at the hands of the convention.
