DEMOCRATIC CONVENTION.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Jan. 22. The National Democratic Committee to-day issued this call:

The National Democratic Committee, at a meeting held this day, in the city of Washington, D. C., has appointed Tuesday, the 21st day of June, 1892, as the time, and chosen the city-of Chicago as the place for holding the National Democratic Convention. Each State is entitled to representation therein equal to double the number of the representation to which it it is entitled in the Electoral College, and each Territory and the Districs of Columbia shall have two delegates.

All Democratic conservative citizens of the United States, irrespective of past political associations and differences, who can unite with us in the effort for a pure, economical and constitutional government, are cordially invited to join us in sending delegates to the Convention.


