TRY FOR THE PREMIUMS.

We are in receipt of premium list of cash premiums to be offered for field crops at the annual fair of North Carolina Agricultural Society, Raleigh, October 18th-27th, 1892. We give below some of the premiums along with the requirements necessary to be complied with, before they can be competed for.

We insist that some of our readers make an effort to secure some of these prizes.

It can be done. With the right preparation and effort, Harnett can take as many premiums at the next fair as any county in the State. We have the fertile soil, our lands are capable of producing a variety of crops, besides our farmers are as experienced as any in the State. Why has not Harnett taken as many premiums as some other counties at the fairs formerly held? Not because our farms and farmers are not able to produce as fine products as other counties, but because there has never been any effort made to win a premium. Farmers it will pay you to try. Even if you do not win you will lose nothing. The increased production as a result of special preparation will more than pay for the trouble it will be; besides it will advertise both you and your county.

The season for planting is now here. Lay off an acre, fertilize it thoroughly and plant in corn, cotton, or some other crop. You will stand as good chance to win as any one.

The first and most important requirement is, in all cases where premiums are offered for the largest yield per acre, the land must be measured by a competent person and a certificate to the accuracy of the same presented with each exhibit.

The following are some of the premiums, and the products on which they are given are the ones that our people are mostly engaged in raising:

Largest yield lint per acre, from 5 acres, first premium, \$20; second premium, \$12.

Largest yield of lint per acre, from 1 acre, \$15.

Best bale of cotton, first premium, \$20; second premium, \$12.

Best packed bale of cotton, \$5.

Largest yield of corn from five acres (two bushels) to be exhibited in the ear and the required statements to be furnished, and certificates to be filed), first, \$30; second, \$10.

Best two bushels white corn, in the ear, first, \$3; second, \$1.

Best two bushels stock corn, in the ear, first, \$3; second, \$1.

Largest yield rice on one acre, first, \$10; second, \$5.

Best bushel cleaned rice, first, \$3; second, \$2.

Largest yield of peas on one acre, one bushel to be exhibited, statements, &c., first, \$10; second, \$5.

Best bushel black-eye peas, first, \$2; second, \$1.

Best bushel clay peas, first, \$2; second \$1.

Best bushel white peas, first, \$2; second, \$1.

Best bushel speckled peas, first, \$2; second, \$1.

Best half bushel ground peas, first, \$3; second, \$1.
