

THE REPUBLICAN CONVENTION.

The Mott-Eaves factions again met in wordy warfare, Eaves getting the best of the fight, being again elected chairman of the Executive Committee.

There were some very lively scenes enacted between the office holders and the outs in the party, in which Powers of Fayetteville, Hancock of Newberne, and others of the Eaves gang, and Marshall Mott, son of Dr. Mott, the Republican boss, and others of the Mott faction indulged in some pretty lurid language. In fact it was a typical Republican Convention—full of bluster and noise—cheap talk and rowdiness.

A word to the wise: If the Republicans cannot hold a convention and maintain order and decency—and they never have succeeded in doing so in North Carolina yet—what would they do in the event of again coming into power in the State? Pandemonium would reign and corruption, thievery and bankruptcy would follow. The Republicans, as was seen from some of the speeches made at this convention, are jubilant over the so-called split in the Democratic party. They hope to capture the State through the Third party. Shall they do it? Not if the Democrats in the Alliance stand firm to the only party that has stood the test of time, a party that once brought us out of the Egypt of Republic blackness and gave us an honest government of the people, for the people and by the people.
