The question of changing Harnett county boundaries was defeated or reported unfavorable by the committee to which it was referred.

J. H. Corten, LL. D. of Oxford, one of the most prominent Methodist preachers in the State, died last Thursday.

In his death his family has lost a faithful father and husband, his community an exemplary man, the county one of its best citizens, and his church one of its brightest jewels.

His remains were placed away by many loving friends in the old cemetery at Summerville Wednesday.

STATE LEGISLATURE.

RALEIGH, Feb. 27. SENATE.

The Senate was called to order at 10 o'clock this morning.

The following bills passed third reading: To establish a stock law in part of the town of Washington; to incorporate the City of Fayetteville; to incorporate the Rutherford and Polk county Railroad; to incorporate the Western and Atlanta Railroad Company; a supplemental act to an act in relation to a stock law in New Hanover county.

Bills passed third reading to amend the charter of Wadesboro; to enable Clerks of Superior Courts to attend the World's Fair; to incorporate the Y. M. C. A. of Raleigh.

Bill to establish a normal school for the colored race in Durham, appropriating for the purpose \$1,300, was laid upon the table.

Bills passed third reading to allow corporations to become surety on bonds; to incorporate the Commercial Bank of Rutherford; to regulate the use of scines in Roanoke and Little rivers; to amend the charter of Pikesville; to repeal chapter 435 of the Laws of 1891, in regard to netting of birds in Davidson county; to protect the fish interests in New river, in Onslow county; to amend the charter of Charlotte, regarding the opening and widening of streets.

Bill to protect prisoners in jail from lynching was made the special order for to-morrow.

Mr. Fields introduced a bill to incorporate Sparta Masonic Lodge.

The Senate then adjourned till 8 p. m.

HOUSE.

The House was called to order at 10 o'clock, Speaker Overman in the chair.

The following bills were introduced:

Mr. Spruill to ratify the purchase of the Cheraw & Salisbury Railroad, and to incorporate the Cheraw & Darlington Railroad Company in North Carolina.

Mr. McNeill, to amend chapter 60, section 3, Laws of 1847, in relation to a Croatan school in Robeson county.

Mr. McNeill to establish a normal institution for the training of white teachers in Robeson county.

The machinery act was then taken up, and after considerable discussion passed its second and third readings.

The special order for to-day was then taken up, the same being a bill to provide for working the convicts on the public roads.

The bill was ably discussed by Messrs. Allen of Wayne, Watson of Forsyth, and Harris of Mecklenburg. A message from Gov. Carr was received and read while the discussion was in progress.

After the reading of the message from the Governor, Mr. Hyde, of Carteret, made a strong speech against the bill. The chief point made against the bill was that no county which could not raise \$1,400 a year could not secure any convict labor at all.

Mr. Moore, of Jackson, moved to table the bill. The motion prevailed. A bill to be entitled an act relating to the Board of Health, came up as a special order. The bill was laid on the table.

Mr. Jones, of Caldwell, moved to reconsider the vote by which the bill was tabled, and insisted upon immediate action on his motion. The motion prevailed; and on that question the ayes and noes were ordered. The vote stood ayes 54, noes 43. So the motion to reconsider prevailed.

The question recurring upon the passage of the bill upon its second reading, the ayes and noes were ordered, and the vote stood—ayes 96, noes 26.

Upon its third reading the bill passed without division.

Mr. Gilmer, of Haywood, by unanimous consent introduced a bill to provide for the speedy trial of certain felonies.

At 2:25 p. m. the House adjourned till 7:30 o'clock to-night.

SPECIAL.

RALEIGH, Feb. 27.—The Senate to-night passed a bill establishing a State banking system for North Carolina, and a bill to pay the debt owned by the State to the estate of David Hinton, deceased. Both bills were special orders and consumed the entire session.

The House to-night, after passing a number of local bills, took up the six per cent. interest bill, as it passed the Senate. After much discussion the bill was laid upon the table, but was taken from the table by a vote of 47 to 43. Amendments were

then passed, exempting the counties of Macon and Caldwell and the House adjourned without further action.

The bill prohibits a greater rate of interest than six per cent. and is to go into effect when Congress shall repeal the ten per cent. tax on State banks of issue.
