The Press Convention held a pleasant, profitable and enjoyable session in New Berne last week in spite of the anticipated excitement.

Craven county will have to pay expenses of 450 State troops which the Sheriff asked the Governor to send.

The most uncalled for thing we have known yet was the calling for State troops at New Berne before the negroes made any resistance or attempted any disorder.

The Washington Military Company will ever think of their trip to New Berne and the James City trouble with the negroes with sad regret, Thursday evening while on a parade Col. Bogart was thrown from a horse and fractured his brain. All the medical attendance both from his own physician and the skill of New Bern could not save him. About 2 o'clock Thursday night he died. He was Colonel of the 1st regiment and held in the highest esteem.

Wednesday the trouble between Mr. James Bryan of New Berne, and James City negroes came to an amicable settlement. Mr. Bryan submitted this contract to them which they have accepted: That he would lease them the houses for 3 years from twenty-five cents to one dollar per month and they have the privilege of moving the houses and all improvements off any time within that period if they pay the rent for the full term of the lease. Most of the negroes have signed the contract, and those who have not will do it. So the much suspected excitement has closed without firing a gun.
