### A BIT OF HISTORY.

DANIEL WEB-TER ONCE IN \*MITH-FIELD.

May 3, 1847, is still remembered by some of the old people of the town as a day of special interest to all the citizens.

Mr. Webster perhaps the most pro found statesmen and orator of his day, was enroute from Rale gh to Wilmington on the date above mentioned, and did really pass through Johnston county, and dined in the town at the Telfair Hotel, which stood on the Surles' (now) lot south of the court house. The main body of this Hotel was for many years the court house, and was moved from the sive of the present court house to whe e it stood until destroyed by fire in the Winter of 1889. Mr, Gales of the party was editor of the Raleigh Register, organ of the Whig party of the State. But I am rambling, and must return to our interesting traveler.

Nothing of special interest occurrred while passing through the county, It is remembered that Mr. Webster took great interest in everything by the road side. At Mr Uriah Baucomb's farm he left the carriage and entered the field where some hands were plowing and examined the plows (the old cutter and dagger) and expressed his surprise that the farmers here still retained such primitive implements. I do not dount that the school boy, whose task it has been to memorize Mr. Webster's speeches, will be anxions to know what brought Mr, Webster down this way. The writer is not positive but is of the opinion that this tour of the South was made by Mr, Webster in order to strengthen his chances for the nomination by the Wing party for the Presidency in 1848. The convention was held and Zachary Taylor, of Louisiana. a Virginian by birth and a General of the war of 1812, received the nomination.

Like Clay, Calhoun and Blaine, Mr Webster did not reach the White House, the long cheerished object of his heart, but this did not dim the lustre of his genuis. No statesman, living or dead, ever made a more imperishable imprint upon the mind of the American people, or ever commanded more attention on the rostrum or in the Senate chamber than did Daniel Webster.
