Mr. Editor:—It seems that Hon. B. F. Grady, our Congressman, has displeased nearly every body at many places, in his recommending postmasters, as nearly every body you meet has something to say against him, but we, not from personal friendship, (for we are not acquainted with the gentleman) nor through sympathy for him while so many are against him, but simply because he deserves our praise and merits our thanks, wish to raise our voice in his behalf, and we hope you will allow this short letter space in your paper.

Our people in this immediate section as well as in a large surrounding scope of country, have never known a convenient postoffice at which to mail and receive their letters, and often having tried several times to have one established, with no avail, we had almost decided to give it up, but on reconsidering, decided to make one more attempt, and wrote Mr. Grady to use his influence for it, which he did, and today we have a post office, the name of which appears at the head of this letter, that is convenient to a vast number of people who thank Mr. Grady for it.

This office is at the store of Mr. Wm. Culbreth, where he does a great deal of business both in naval stores and general merchandise, which will make it convenient for all his customers, many of whom live at some distance, thus giving this office a large territory and much patronage. We have a daily mail, making connection with the mail both North and South, at Godwin, which is three miles from here.

What makes us still more grateful to Mr. Grady, was his promptness in this matter, which shows that he has the interest of constituents at heart, and wishes to please them, but in this case not only Democrats thank him but many of our People's party friends as well.

To show how prompt he was, let me say, we only had to write one letter, asking him to use his influence for us, and to recommend Mr. J. M. Starling for postmaster, and in just a few weeks the post office department of our Government asked Mr. Starling to make up his bond, which he did, and today our mail is coming and going, while we have one of the cleverest postmasters in the State.

This is indeed a poor letter, and doesn't half express our gratitude to Mr. Grady, but we hope it will escape the waste basket and show the people that everybody is not displeased with our Congressman, and should Mr. Grady chance to see this, we hope he may know by it that he is not wholly without friends in his district.
