Don't wait cate that the first part of the week was very unfavorable on account of much rain, cloudy weather and lack of sunshine. After Thursday the weather was good, except some cool nights during last few days. Special reports concerning ootton indicate a very unfavorable outlook. The probable yield cannot be estimated over seventy-five per cent., and will be prohably considerably under that figure. Out of over a hundred reportonly five make cotton in a good condition, with prospects of average
