

WASHINGTON LETTER

(Special Correspondence of Central Times.)

The fourth draft of the pending tariff bill which was laid before the Senate for consideration the 2nd day of last April names the 30th of June as the time when the law shall go into effect. That day ends the fiscal year throughout all the prolonged debate which has since occupied the Senate. Mr. Jones and Harris have contended they would begin collecting duties under the new law with the beginning of the new fiscal year. The present condition of things hardly supports their belief. There are several very important schedules yet to be considered, to say nothing of matters that have been left open pending final action when the bill comes up for final consideration by the Senate.

The feature of the week in the tariff debate was the speech of Senator Vest. The day was one of low barometer for the Democrats, and it was a wonder that Senator Vest uttered almost a cry of despair. His appeal to the Republicans to kill the bill at once, if the could do so, rather than subject it to lingering torture, set the keystone and made the atmosphere for the time being heavy with a feeling of depression. It was not that the Democrats had any real grounds for doubting that the bill would eventually pass. It was more because, as the old proverb has it, that hope deferred maketh the heart sick. The expressions of the Republican leaders had been of a nature to encourage the Democrats to believe that a vote would be reached within the ten days. But the long and fruitless discussions and the absolute lack of progress with the bill led the Democrats to the conclusion that it would not be wise to trust too much to sentimental belief. "If you mean to defeat this bill then do it like men," Mr. Vest exclaimed, passionately, "and do not assassinate it by parliamentary technicalities and by delay. We exhausted more than two and a half hours yesterday on eggs. And we have started out now to take half a day on hay. At the same rate it will be six months before the Senate comes to the vote on the measure. In the meantime business is stricken down like an ox in the shambles, and are holding up their trembling hands in every portion of the country asking that this debate shall terminate. If you desire to beat this bill, strike it down in fair and open debate. Do not let it be kicked to death by grasshoppers." This close to an otherwise dramatic incident was drowned in laughter.

It is about settled now that the somewhat-eclipsed Star of Kentucky will not take charge of the general deficiency bill in the House. The bill will probably be in charge of Mr. Sayers, chairman of the committee. It has been known for some time that there was a strong sentiment in the House and in the committee against Mr. Breckenridge retaining the management of the bill on the floor. Finally, it is understood, the matter has been settled by the request being made of him formally to relinquish the control of the bill. It is said that he will "voluntarily" surrender the management of the bill, upon the grounds that his canvass is taking up so much of his time.
