In the absence of D. H. McLean chairman of the county executive committee, who was detained at home by sicknes. in his family, the convention was called to order by G. K Grantham of Dunn, who was made permanent chairman, and J. P. Pittman, of THE COUNTY UNION WAS made secretary.

A rell of townships was called and all were found to be represented with good large delegations.

A committee on credentials and resolutions were appointed by the shair and the convention adjourned to hear the addresses of Hon. Frank Thompson, Democratic nominee for Congress in this district, and H. J .lines, E-q , Democratic nominee for State Senator, who made strong and effective speeches.
