The Democratic Executive-Committee Pass stirring Resolutions.

THE WHITE MAN AND THE WHITE METAL.

The Democracy of the State and all others who believe in the true principles of the Democratic party will rejoice when they read of the action of the Democratic State Executive Committee last night.

Plans were inaugurated for the organization of the party and an address was issued that will be hailed with delight from Murphy to Manteo.

THE RINGING ADDRESS. The representatives of the Democratic party in North Carolina congratulate the Democrats of her sister States, who, with a firm stand for the principles embodied in the Chicago platform, have won splendid victories for the people.

"It is equally pronounced, whether we hear it loud and free in the wheat fields of Ohio and

Iowa, or struggling for utterance in the wealth congested centre of "Greater New York" where the candidates for mayor received 80,000 plurality—a candidate whose campaign utterance was: "I am a Democrat who was heart and soul for the Chicago platform and the candidates who stood on it."

"No less significant is the fact that the people of the State of New York have elected by 70,000 majority as chief justice of the court of Appeals a statesman who sought support by announcing that he had voted for Hon. Wm. J. Bryan last year."

"And with this glorious news of Democratic success we rejoice that "sham international bimetalism" has been exposed. There is now no room for Republican dodging.

"We reaffirm our belief in the principles of the Chicago and State platforms of the Democratic party as adopted in 1896, in their entirety; and we will still support those principles until they are written in our laws.

"We would be untrue to the firm and loyal allegiance the Democratic party of North Carolina bears to our greatest leader, Hon. William J. Bryan, if we failed to express our confidence in his honor and integrity and in his devotion of head and heart to the welfare of all the people.

"We view with alarm the depressed condition of trade and the low prices of all products raised by our people but we remind those who heard Republican orators in 1896 predict dire disaster if the Democrats were elected that McKinley is President of these United States and both branches of Congress are Republican.

"In less than one year opportunity will be given the voters to express a firm adherence to those principles. We regret that the ballot box was not this year opened to all North Carolinians. North Carolina is now accidentally Republican.

"The supply of oysters in the sounds and rivers of North Carolina," says Mr. White "is almost inexhaustible, and all the industry needs to make a grand success in a market sufficient to induce buyers to come to the State. And to do that dredging must take the place in part of tongs, which is a slow method of taking oysters.

North Carolina Second. In production of tobacco North Carolina stands second in the Union, Kentucky alone preceding her. For the year 1896 the State produced 65,629,170 pounds, against 42,043,620 pounds for the year ending January 1st, 1895. The product for 1896 was valued at \$3,783,926.

The Western Revenue district of North Carolina last year manufactured 14,913,567 pounds of plug tobacco, while for the same period the factories of the Eastern district produced 12,015,675 pounds. The Western district manufactured 371,010 pounds of smoking tobacco and the Eastern district manufactured 4,512,978 cigars, 336,913-500 cigarettes and 6,300 pounds of snuff.
