

and suits are enjoined in consequence of failure of sheriff to settle. We cannot settle with the State and County unless the people settle with us. We dislike to have to resort to a process of law to get the taxes, but unless the taxes are paid and paid at once, this process will be necessary.

I have visited the townships as required by law to receive the taxes. Not one of 30 has met us for the purpose of paying. For the accommodation of the public and to facilitate collections I will visit each of the townships again, during the hours on days named :

On the 4th day of December each of the townships of the county will be put into the hands of a competent deputy to collect all arrears.
