of Dunn is hereby authorized and empowered to issue bonds in the name of the town of act. Dunn, in such denominations and forms as it may determine, to an amount not exceeding thirty-five thousand dollars, payable at such time or times and at such place or places as the board of commissioners may 1901. prescribe, Provided, that the time of payment of such bonds shall not be more than thirty years from their date.

Section 2. That the said bonds shall bear interest at no greater rate than six per centum per annum, and the interest shall be payable annually, or semiannually as the board of


