



DO YOU WANT TO VOTE?

It is materially essential that every white man, who is required to pay poll tax should have his tax receipt on or be-fore May 1st, 1902. No danger confronts us on account of the educational qualification among our people because those that cannot read and write as prescribed by the Amendment to the Constitution, could vote on Jan. 1st, 1867, or prior thereto, and if not in this class, they are the lineal descendants of some person who could, and hence the white people of Harnett county will not be effected

along this line by the new law. This part of the Amendment to the Constitution has been considered the most vital part of it-and is, to all except the white people-the part that 4 of Chap. II, of the Adjourned Session 1900 of the Legislature of North Carolina which requires that "before he (the elector) shall be entitled to vote he shall have paid on or before the first day of May of the year in which he proposes to vote, his poll tax for the previous year as prescribed by Article V. persons between the ages of twenty-one and fifty years. Those voters who are over fifty will not be effected by this part of the law.
