



The bridges could not be replaced without some provision for this fund. They were, therefore, declared a public necessity and \$1840.70 tax levied for the purpose. These bridges were promptly replaced and paid for.

No special tax is levied for the purpose of bridges this year except for the payment of interest and principal of the bonds issued for building the Lilling-ton Bridge. This levy of five cents on each \$100 or 15 cents on each poll, is small, though sufficient to meet the payments of interest and principal of the

A reduction of the tax levy for the payment of the Court House bonds was also made, fixing the rate at 10 cents on each \$100 or 30 cents on the poll.

This reduction is made possible by the greatly increased valuation of the county. For all special purposes for

1902 fifteen cents on each \$100 or 45 cents on each poll is levied. Poll tax therefore for 1901 is \$2.45.

The sweeping reduction of the county debt already, the efcounty's finances, the steadily increasing taxable values, makes possible the easy and speedy payment of the remaining county debt.
