It is proposed, too, to deliver cotton at Fall River and New Bedford by water transportation Practice wherever his services the insurance to be borne by the transportation companies, and it is said the transportation companies have virtually come to the relief of the New England mills, which are indeed hard pressed, even in this period of prosperity.

All such relief is, however, chimercal. Railroads and steamboats are not conducted by men who are in search of health. They are in search of dividends, the fatter the better, and any agreement to the contrary will not prove enduring.

The best settlement of the problem consists in putting upon South the manufacturing of coarse cotton stuffs and upon New England the making of fine goods-the two to pull together against the rest of the world. New England has the capital and skill to make all sorts of fine cotton goods, and the variety of them is becoming larger every year. It is a reflection upon this country that the greater part of its raw cotton is carried away to be spun and woven in other countries. Every pound of it should be spun here and much of it woven here. As things stand however, we spin but a third of it.
