Examining Our Street Railway. Asheville was honored yesterday with a visit by two prominent citizens of our capital city-Dr. V. E. Turner and Mr. R. T. Gray, of Raleigh.

They were shown the workings of the system on the road in all its details. Then they were taken to the central station and shown the Armington & Sims engine and the Edison dynamo. They expressed themselves as not only gratified but astonished at the successful working of the whole system and stated that they intended to do all in their power to supplant the present horse system in Raleigh by the same electrical sys-
