New Mexico is about twice as large as North Carolina; a semi-tropical country with water, timber, and genial soil; and if families are crowded in, as they are in England or Ireland, or even some parts of New England, fifteen million of people

could- be amply provided for. Our Congress would donate all the lands not already entered, and in possession, and the negroes themselves, (eight or ten of them now in the Southern States, worth a million each,) could make a grand buy out all the owners of the lands, and sell to their own people on time, with installment payments, reserving the right until paid for, so that emigrant families could go at once to work. 
