A Suggestion to Our Boys.

Editor Citizen.—Being much interested in anything that pleases or offends the half a century ago, I am delighted to note the steps taken to establish a branch of the Young Men's Christian Association in Asheville, and would venture a suggestion therewith which may be worthy their consideration.

Perhaps few persons are aware of the great facilities which are now afforded in the acquisition of a practical speaking knowledge of foreign languages. Under the Meistershaft system, as now arranged, any young man or woman who is willing to give a short time each day can in a few months learn enough of French or German, or both, to be of estimable advantage in case they should ever have the chance to visit Europe, and even if such privilege is denied, the knowledge will surely be valuable in America, which is so rapidly being peopled by foreigners.

Now, my suggestion is that one feature to be early adopted by the Young Men's Christian Association, be the establishment of a class in both French and German. We have persons in our midst who are abundantly capable of conducting it, and the necessary Meistershaft books can be quickly obtained at very small cost. Flight With the Outlaw Burrows.
