We take especial pleasure in noting that the revival of the American navy is due to a democratic secretary of the navy; and it is just to add that the present republican secretary is the inheritor of all the pride and purpose of his predecessor.

But we would prefer a return to the testable substitutes of the war rather than witness general admission of a slavery so subject to the use of coffee as to compel testifying submission to the expectations of speculation.
