Mr. Cleveland Elected a Member. RAILWAY, N. J., November 21.—The Jacksonian Legion of the democratic club of this city, at its meeting last week elected Mr. Cleveland an honorary member of the organization.

Disastrous Storm at Newberne. RALEIGH, November 21.—A special dispatch to the News and Observer today reports a fearful storm struck Newberne coming from the southwest. The plate and pulp factory of S. H. Gray, in which there were sixty slaves, was leveled to the ground.

The Alien Contract Labor Law. WASHINGTON, November 21.—The United States district attorney at Norfolk, Va., was today instructed to bring suit against certain English cotton brokers for violation of the alien contract labor law; provided, he is satisfied such suits can be maintained.

The Government Had No Case. DANVILLE, Va., November 21.—This afternoon P. S. Clark, W. H. Power and H. J. Dodson, of Kingsford precinct were arraigned before United States commissioner Lewis charged with violation of the election laws at the last congressional election. United States District Attorney Craig said he had investigated the charges and found that the government had no case against the accused and asked that the warrants be dismissed, which was done, and the persons accused were discharged from custody.

North Dakota's Senators. BISMARCK, N. D., November 21.—Gilbert A. Pierce was elected Senator by the legislature today. The joining of the attempted to force a vote for the second Senator in the house, but a motion to adjourn was carried by two votes. A republican conference committee has been appointed to call a caucus, but as it is a tie no call will be issued, and the second senatorship will probably have to be fought out in the legislature.
