**Another Prize Fight.**  
 BRUSSELS, December 23.—A fight between Jim Smith, of England, and Frank Slavio, the Australian champion was fought this morning in private grounds situated three miles from Bruges. There was much squabbling from the outset and the conduct of Smith's party-relaxed at the conclusion of the 14th round declared the fight a draw and refused to remain on the grounds. Smith's party evidently saw their position was beaten and broke into the ring and interfered with the fair progress of the fight.

**Fatal Collision.**  
 ISHPEKING, Mich., December 23.—There was a tail end collision on the Duluth division of the Duluth, South Shore and Atlantic railroad yesterday morning. One freight train ran into the rear end of another, because of the failure of a brakeman on the first section to go out and flag. Brakeman Ryan, who was asleep in the caboose of the first section, was instantly killed, and his companion, T. Cammers, was fatally injured. It was also Chatham, the engineer of the second section.

**Burning of Cotton Cargoes.**  
 LONDON, December 23.—The cotton steamers Suez and Hawana from Savannah have been burned on the quay at Genoa, fifteen hundred bales damaged by fire and water. The cargoes of steamers' mine and Letembro from New Orleans is reported to have been destroyed.

**Disastrous Cave In.**  
 AS, Cal., December 23.—A cave in the land mine, Ange-mino, Calaveras county, containing sixteen men, three of whom were killed and three injured, was reported to have been destroyed.
