MORE THAN ENOUGH OF IT.

When the bloody tragedy of Barnwell was recently enacted there was a feeble extenuation suggested by the causeless murder of white men by negroes.

But Col. Pope on the whole talks sensibly. We quote from his address the following paragraphs. We have frequently before in our own language, through these columns, expressed the same ideas.

Fifty years ago, there was some excuse for bad roads, for our country was poor. Now it is rich, there is no excuse.

A good road is always to be desired, and is a source of comfort and convenience to every traveler.

Good roads attract population, as well as good schools and churches. Good roads improve the value of property, so that it is said a farm lying five miles from market connected by a bad road, is of less value than an equally good farm lying ten miles away from market, connected by a good road.

The joint resolution introduced into the house on Monday by Mr. Cummings, of New York, providing for the erection of a monument to the memory of Samuel J. Tilden, may provoke the merriment of the republican party, and no doubt will do so, because they have had all the benefits accruing from the administration of a president seated by fraud.

But severely had the agitation aroused by so monstrous a tragedy subsided, and the assumption gladly reached that under the indignant reprobation of a crime so cruel and needless, no repetition of it was to be apprehended.

When we see these things done openly, defiantly, wantonly, brutally, we might feel that the South was stripped of all defence and stood naked before the world in all the hideousness of inherent barbarity.
