Unaccountable Action of a Dog at the Death of Her Brother.

The following remarkable instance of canine sagacity savors of psychical phenomena, and will be interesting alike to lovers of dogs and students of psychology.

Councilman Charles A. Sanborn of Cambridge secured two Irish setter pups, a white ago, which grew into beautiful, intelligent dogs. They were brother and sister, and were named Nanki Pool and Yum Yum. About six months ago Mr. Sanborn gave Yum Yum to a man living in a country town several miles from Boston, and kept "Nanki."

In the forenoon of two weeks ago last Sunday Mr. Sanborn rode on horseback to Hyde Park and return, while Nanki trotted gaily at his side. In the afternoon Mr. Sanborn and family went for a drive behind the handsome span that Nanki had been with his wain, followed at a short distance to the rear. The course taken was across the Brookline bridge to Cottage farm, at which point Mr. Sanborn saw that his pet was still pursuing the carriage, then up the Brighton road toward Alston. A few minutes later, upon turning around, he missed the animal, but presuming that Nanki had become confused at the press of turns at that part of the road, and that he would run home when he discovered that he had lost his master's team, gave little thought to the matter.

But the dog was not at home when they arrived, nor did he put in an appearance that night. Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday passed, and no tidings having been received of the animal's whereabouts, it was supposed that he had been stolen. On Thursday, however, a postal was received by Mr. Sanborn from Warren White, of Stoughton, stating that the dog had crawled into that gentleman's door almost exhausted, and whining piteously. Friday a messenger was sent to Stoughton to procure Nanki Pool, but only to find him dead. Mr. White explained that the dog had obtained refuse sustenance, and that morning had looked up at the gentleman with almost human anguish depicted on his face, and, sorrowfully soliloquizing, expired.

It seems that the faithful creature had retraced the Sunday morning trail to Hyde Park, and after running perhaps hundreds of miles back and forth in his vain search for his master, died of a broken heart.

And now comes the strangest part of the story. At about 10 o'clock Friday morning Mr. Sanborn was awakened at his home in Cambridgeport by what he thought was the howling of a dog in his yard and a scratching on the front door. He listened intently, but all being still he concluded it was a dream caused by his mind being weighted with the loss of Nanki Pool. He was about dropping again into sound slumber when the door opened and a small, shaggy dog, which he recognized as Nanki Pool, but Yum Yum, who, paying no attention to Mr. Sanborn or the other inmates of the dwelling, who had by this time arisen, bounded upstairs as if mad; then down again and out to the stables and back, all the while moaning piteously, and finally dropping at Mr. Sanborn's feet, uttering a low, mournful cry. This was just before 2 o'clock in the morning, and, upon comparison, was found to be exactly the time when Nanki Pool died heartbroken in Stoughton. When it is remembered that Yum Yum might have run back to her old home at any time during the past six months, but never did, and that she chose that particular night and hour, the significance is apparent. She wanders disconsolately about the premises, sniffing in every corner for faithful Nanki and apparently sorrowfully lamenting her brother's loss; and Mr. Sanborn says that he will never again part with loyal Yum Yum if he can help it.—Boston Globe.
