SOME INSTRUCTIVE AND PERTINENT INFORMATION.

A Letter From E. L. Coleman That Ought to Settle the Atlanta, Asheville, and Baltimore Railway Question and Settle it Right.

The following letter has been received by Natt. Atkinson from R. L. Coleman at Camp Hope Mills:

I look upon the building of the Atlanta, Asheville and Baltimore railway as a matter of great importance to our people. I believe it will be a blessing to that country. When I look at the barren sands, and the worn out lands through which I have been building railroads in Eastern North Carolina and South Carolina for the last few years, and then look at the splendid country through which the A. & B. road is to run, I wonder why somebody is not building that road. And this is not all that I will mention. This country through which we are now building, already has a railroad doing a good business. Here we are contesting with the old road for a share of its business. For six miles below my camp, the two roads are almost in sight of each other. At my camp they are only 900 feet apart. For 36 miles beyond they are only a few miles from each other. Last year at this very season and month, I was building a road from Columbia, S. C., and right along side of the old Columbia and Greenville road, and the Laurens road, and for twenty miles of our line we were so near, that we often just widened their track bed to make room for ours, (widened their cuts and fills). That road was built by a private company who have the faith to go in right along side this old occupant, put their money into it, and to get getting for the rent of it, \$4,000 a month, \$48,000 a year.

These townships are asked to give nothing but their moral support and for this they are secured. They are not required to issue any bonds until they are certain the interest will be met by the private stock holders. This is \$12,000 a year, or \$200,000.

I will if necessary, be one of twelve to place in any of the Asheville banks to the credit of the county commissioners, \$1,000 each to secure them from loss, and I will send the \$1,000 any day if called for. I do wish I could make somebody see the importance, the worth of this enterprise as I see it.

Some Strong Points.

EDITOR THE CITIZEN:—THE CITIZEN is a live newspaper and is alive to the interests of this city in every way. Will THE CITIZEN have the kindness to help along the new railroad by informing the people that if the fight goes through and we get another line of railroad it is worth more than any thing the people of this section can do in any other way? If we get a railroad to Bristol it brings us within 130 miles of the finest soft coal today and making the best grade of coke in the United States. It sells at Big Stone Gap for \$1.75 per ton, and only an inferior grade can be bought in Asheville for \$7.00 per ton. This will be reduced fifty per cent, as soon as we make connection at Bristol with the South Atlantic and Ohio railroads. The price of both anthracite and bituminous coal will be reduced at least twenty-five per cent. The rate of freight north and west would be reduced ten to twenty per cent. We would be four to six hours nearer New York and Philadelphia; six to eight hours nearer Cincinnati.

By connecting at Bristol with the Norfolk and Western railroad we would have a cheap line of freight north via the Old Dominion line from Norfolk. We would soon reach Chicago via the Norfolk and Western, as they now own a line as far as Columbus, Ohio, and are building from there to Chicago via Fort Wayne, Ind.

We would then be able to procure a rate of freight that would enable manufacturing industries, without which no city has ever grown to much importance, to come here.

We would get more winter travel as we have the fare, New York to Asheville, is \$22.00 and to Jacksonville, Fla., 500 miles further south, \$25.00; and hundreds of people who want to escape a month or two of cold weather during the winter go there to be certain of warm weather, where, if there was a lower rate of fare here, would be induced to try Asheville, while the difference of only \$3 sends them to Florida now.

Remember, most of this rate from New York is over the Richmond and Danville railroad to Asheville, and the Norfolk and Western controls all our freight and passenger business at as high a rate as the railroad commissioners will allow.

I came here because I think it the best place to live as far as climate in the United States, but we never will get any rates of freight or any industries to come here or a city of any importance without a competing line of railroad in some direction and this one via Bristol is the shortest and best for us. Very respectfully, Pres. dent.
