The following letter has been received by Natt. Atkinson from R. L. Coleman, at Camp Hope Mills:

people. I believe it will be a blessing to V. Clifton, Raleigh. that country. When I look at the barren sands, and the worn out lands through which I have been building railroads in Eastern North Carolina and South Carolina for the last few years, and then look at the splendid country through which the A., A. and B. road is to run, I wonder why somebody is not building that road. And this is not all that I will mention. This country through which we are now building, already has a railroad doing a good business. Here we low my camp, the two roads are almost in sight of each other. At my camp they are only 900 feet apart. For 36 miles beyond they are only a few miles Hills, N. J.; Jas. A. Durant, Bishopville, from each other. Last year at this S. C.; J. M. Covington, Laurinburg; Mrs. very season and month, I was building a road from Columbia, S. C., and right along side of the old Columbia and Greenville road, and the Laurens road. and for twenty miles of our line we were so near, that we often just widened their road bed to make room for ours, (widened their cuts and fills). That road was built by a private company who have the faith to go in right along side this old occupant, put their money into it,

and today they are getting for the rent of it, \$4,000 a month, \$48,000 a year. These townships are asked to give nothing but their moral support and for this they are secured. They are not required to issue any bonds until they are certain the interest will be met by the private stock holders. This is \$12,000 year, or \$200,000.

I do wish I could make somebody see the importance, the worth of this enterprise as I see it.

there to Chicago via Fort Wayne, Ind.
We would then be able to procure a
rate of freight that would enable manufacturing industries, without which no city has ever grown to much importance, to come here.

We would get more winter travel as now the fare, New York to Asheville, is \$22 00 and to Jacksonville, Fla., 500 Room 24, Barnard Building, miles further south, \$25.00; and hundreds of people who want to escape a mouth or two of cold weather during the winter go there to be certain of warm wenther, where, if there was a lower rate of fare here, would be induced to try Asbeville, while the difference of only \$3 sends them to Florida now.
