HALIFAX N. S., Oct. 2 .- The most disastrous fire that has visited Halifax for years broke out at 11 o'clock last night in the Merlin planing mill, on Taylor's wharf. In a few minutes the place was all ablaze and the fire spread rapidly. A breeze from the north carried live sparks to the buildings on the wharves south of the fire.

The whole department was called out and engines from Dartmouth came to render assistance. In an hour four firms were burned out, and by this time the fire had spread to the Liverpool wharf on the north and burned out several business houses.

The fire also spread simultaneously to the south, and soon the immense fish warehouses of John Faylor & Co., were ourned. By 2 o'clock a whole block has been destroyed.
