THE CRISIS IN FRANCE

THE ROYALIST PARTY VERY ACTIVE JUST NOW.

They Hope To Kill Off The Republic and Place The Monarchy Again In Power—The Preferred Leader of Monarchists.

PARIS, Dec. 21.—The excitement over the Panama scandal is greater to-day than ever, and the wildest reports are afloat of Monarchist plots and coming arrests. It is asserted that a Monarchist has been in communication in London with agents of the court of Paris and that the exposure of Talerer Checks is directly attributable to royalist influences.

Another rumor is that officials and deputies, as well as civilians, connected with the Panama scandal have had it intimated to them that their scandal lies in the exposure of royalist's schemes, and that all their offenses will be condoned if they consent to destroy the republic.

Some confidence is placed by well informed people in both these rumors, and it is apparent that royalist agents have assumed an activity they had not displayed for years. It is also evident that royalist money is again circulating. Should affairs take a turn favorable to a coup d'etat in behalf of royalty, it is probable, according to current report, that the young Duke of Orleans would be selected to lead the attack. The Duke is more popular than any other member of his family and his offer to serve in the army as a conscript when he became of age made a wide impression.

The great difficulty in the way of a royalist coup is that there are no signs of disloyalty to the army. Freycinet, minister of war, is untouched by the scandals that have besmirched his colleague, Rouvier, and he has the devoted and loyal attachment of the generals in high command.

MALLOY-FAGG WEDDING

NOTABLE WEDDING IN CENTRAL CHURCH.

Mr. T. F. Malloy and Miss Minnie M. Fagg Married in Asheville at Noon Today—A Bridal Trip Through Florida.

Just at noon today the most notable wedding of Asheville's winter season took place in Central Methodist church. The principals were Miss Minnie M. Fagg and Mr. Theodore Frederic Malloy, and the church held a large number of Asheville people. Miss Fagg is the only daughter of Capt. M. J. Fagg, one of the wealthy men of this section, and no young woman in the city has more friends. Endowed by nature with a bright intellect, her many attractions are greatly enhanced by the advantages of a good education and she is well fitted to adorn a high sphere in life.

The groom is no stranger in Asheville. For some time he has held the position of teller in the First National bank here and is a young man who makes friends readily and commands the respect of everybody who has business dealings with him. He is a South Carolinian by birth and a member of one of the oldest and best families in the Palmetto State. Central church was decorated with holly and mistletoe in a way that was simplicity in itself, but was yet highly effective. The chancel rail was decorated in green, and at the center, immediately in front of the altar was an arch of the same material, under which the bride and groom stood during the ceremony. A magnificent love knot of carnations was suspended from the point of the arch and hung just over the heads of the pair.

With Prof. Kneringer at the organ playing Mendelssohn's Wedding march, the bride walked down the left aisle of the church, leaning in the arm of her maid of honor, Miss Emma Rollins. The bride carried a bouquet of white roses, and the maid of honor pink roses. The groom came down the right aisle with Arthur Rankin, as best man. The wedding party was preceded by the ushers, Messrs. Frank S. Smith and W. R. Heslop, Thad E. Clayton and John Campbell.

When the party reached the chancel, the wedding service was performed by Bishop Rothmeyer, president of the Salem Female academy, with the beautiful ceremony of the Moravian church. Rev. H. E. Christelberg, pastor of Central church, stood in the chancel during the marriage service.

The bride was dressed in a very handsome traveling suit of mazarine blue diagonal cloth, trimmed in cut velvet and jet, with hat to match. The maid of honor's dress was a pretty gray camel's hair with fur trimmings, and pink velvet hat, trimmed in black. From the church the bridal party went to the residence of Captain Fagg on North Main street and lunched. The inside of the house was handsomely decked in Christmas greens. In the front parlor were displayed the gifts that loving friends had sent the pair. These revealed in number and magnificence any display of a similar nature that has been seen in Asheville's history. Everything, almost, that a newly married couple could want was included.

Mr. and Mrs. Kollack of Cheraw, S. C., attended the wedding. Mrs. Kollack is a sister of Mr. Malloy. Mr. and Mrs. Malloy left on the 2:45 train this afternoon for Cheraw, where they will spend Christmas.
