

EDITOR THE CITIZEN:-Many persons thoughtlessly leave their vehicles standing on the streets, the horses unhitched and unattended. A serious accident was thus caused yesterday. Please quote the following extract from the city ordinance: and give every one notice that hereafter it will be enforced:

"Sec. 843. No person shall suffer his vehicle to stand on any street without holding the reins, except in case of a wagon, cart, or dray while delivering or receiving a load. Any person offending against any provision of this section shall be fined five dollars." *T. W. Patton*, Mayor.


